# QUANTICO NNOA CHAPTER REPRESENTED AT THE NATIONAL CONVENTION

Officers from the Quantico Chapter of the NNOA attended the 28<sup>th</sup> Annual NNOA Conference, which took, place Aug 2-5 at the Naval Amphibious Base, Coronado, Ca. Top leaders of our nation's Sea Services provided a wealth of professional guidance to more than 300 Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard Officers during the four-day event.

"We as NNOA leaders need to ensure that we get our fair share of quality personnel so that our ranks are filled with quality young men and women," said Major General Arnold Fields, USMC, Director, Marine Corps Staff, at an Aug 4<sup>th</sup> luncheon. MGen Fields said that it is important that we remind corporate America of our contribution to the economy. MGen Fields went on to inform the audience of sea service officers and guests of the Commandant of the Marine Corps' assessment of the military's impact on the economy. Per General James L. Jones, if the Sixth Fleet did not protect the high seas, what would be the impact of diminishing returns for corporations? MGen Fields ended his speech with four thoughts: trust and know what it means; tolerance should be a measure of consideration for leadership; put unit before self and say yes.

The Theme of the four-day conference was "NNOA: Developing Leaders For The New Millennium."

Attendees were afforded the opportunity to be mentors and also receive guidance from senior leaders. Workshops included discussions on diversity in the workforce; effective career management; the role of the junior officer in the new millennium; and other topics. "NNOA's theme relates to the readiness of the sea services and is not a social experiment, "said VADM Edward J. Moore Jr, USN, Commander, Naval Forces Pacific during the opening ceremonies. NNOA SPONSORED MENTORING PME AT TBS Like the civilian business sector, the Marine Corps have also created mentor programs to assist junior officers, women and minorities. To be successful these programs should be deliberate and operate under the same procedures as Professional Military Education (PME). On Friday, 8 Sept 00, a PME on mentoring was conducted by Col Johnson at Reasoner Hall, TBS. The PME covered topics such as how to be a mentor? How to find a mentor? What are the responsibilities of a mentor? After the informative and motivational PME, the meeting adjourned to the TBS Officer's Club for a social hour for mentoring and networking with some of

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the officers assigned to TBS.

The panel discussion topic was "Leadership Strategies for Retaining A Diversified Quality Workforce". A common theme during the panel discussion was "perform where you are". RADM Diaz was quoted as saying "Don't worry about the next job, bloom in place and the future will take care of itself".

Other distinguished guests at the conference were ADM James M. Loy, Commandant of the Coast Guard; RADM David L. Brewer II, USN, Vice Chief of Naval Education and Training; RADM Richard H. Wells, USNR, Superintendent, Naval Postgraduate School Monterey; BGen Stephen T. Johnson, USMC, Director, Manpower; Admiral Fred Ames, Assistant Commandant for Human Resources, and BGen James M. Feigley, Commander, Marine Corps Systems Command who made a presentation to the Marines.

Events included NNOA Youth Day. The Youth Day, covered by San Diego's Local Channel 7 news included seminars in goal setting, drug prevention, improving communications between teens and parents and much more. The Youth Day also included a visit to five ships at Naval Station, San Diego. One hundred and sixty area youth visited the USS Cleveland, USS Compstock, USS Peleliu, USS Fitzgerald, and USCG Edisto. The day culminated with a cookout and recreational activities at ADM Baker Field, US Army Reserve Center San Diego. The theme for that one-day program was "Yes I Can".

After the conference, LtCol Denice Williams, Vicepresident of the Quantico Chapter remarked, "As usual, the synergy at the Annual Conference was motivating! The task now for the Quantico Chapter is to maintain that spirit and invigorate our membership to develop and mentor more junior officers."



Born and raised in Portsmouth, Virginia, Lieutenant Colonel Williams received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Pre-Med Biology from Norfolk State College and her Masters of Art Degree in International Studies from Old Dominion University. She has also completed the Naval War College Non-Resident Seminar Program.

Lieutenant Colonel Williams received her commission via the Women Officers Candidate Course in August 1976. Her first duty station was Camp Lejeune, North Carolina where she performed as the Clothing Branch Officer from January 1977-December 1979. She was then transferred to Women Recruit Training Command in Parris Island, South Carolina where she served as a Series Commander, Recruit Company Commander, and Headquarters Company Commander from December 1979-December 1982. During this time she was promoted to Captain and was featured in *Ebony* Magazine.

Lieutenant Colonel Williams has served in various Supply and Logistics Officers billets in Okinawa, Quantico, and Little Creek, Virginia. While assigned to Landing Force Training Command, NAB Little Creek, she was promoted to Major and accepted for the Special Education Program. She was the Battalion Executive Officer at Headquarters and Service Battalion, 2d FSSG from September 1992-October 1994. Her next assignment was as an instructor in the Political Science Department of the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland from November 1994-July 1997. It was during this assignment that she was promoted to her present rank. Her last overseas assignment was Logistics Officer, Marine Wing Support Group 17, 1st Marine Air Wing in Okinawa, Japan from August 1997-July 1998. She currently serves as the Branch Head, Program Support Logistics, Program Support Directorate, Marine Corps Systems Command, Quantico.

LtCol Williams personal awards include two Meritorious Service Awards and the Navy Achievement Medal.
